The 2026 Ambassador Cruise Line World Indoor Bowls Championships

I really enjoy this time of year when the 2026 Ambassador Cruise Line World Indoor Bowls Championships are set to return to the iconic blue rink at Potters Resorts, Hopton-on-Sea. The competition will run from January 9th to January 25th.

Often called the "Crucible of Bowls," this 17-day festival of sport brings together the World Bowls Tour's top 16 ranked players and a host of international qualifiers to compete for the most prestigious titles in the indoor game.

I thought I'd give you all a little bit of information about it!

What to Watch For

The 2026 championships follow a historic 2025 tournament where Scotland's Jason Banks completed an unprecedented "treble," winning the Open Singles, Open Pairs and Mixed Pairs. All eyes will be on him to see if he can maintain his dominance against a field of legendary veterans and hungry newcomers.

The Main Competitions

World Open Singles: The blue-ribbon event where the world's best face off in high-stakes matchplay.

World Open Pairs: Tactical brilliance and teamwork on full display.

Ladies World Matchplay: Featuring the elite of the women's game (Defending champion: Julie Forrest).

Mixed Pairs World Matchplay: A fast-paced fan favourite.

Under-25s Championship: A glimpse at the future stars of the sport.

Key Players & Favourites

Player | Status | Why they are a threat.

Jason Banks | Defending Champion | The man to beat after his historic triple-title run in 2025.

Stewart Anderson | World No. 1 Contender | A three-time champion known for his clinical drawing game.

Paul Foster MBE | Legend | A 5-time singles winner who always finds his best form at Potters.

Alex Marshall MBE | The GOAT | With 6 singles titles, "Tattie" remains the most decorated player in history.

Julie Forrest | Ladies Champion | Looking to extend Scotland's recent "clean sweep" of the major trophies.

How to Follow the Action

If you aren't lucky enough to have tickets for the International Arena, there are several ways to watch:

- Television: The BBC (BBC Two and iPlayer) traditionally provides extensive coverage during the second week of the tournament.
- Online: The World Bowls Tour YouTube channel streams matches live for global viewers throughout the qualifying rounds and early stages.
- Live Scores: Real-time updates are usually available via the official World Bowls Tour website and Potters Resorts' social media channels.

The Potters Atmosphere

What makes this event unique is the "all-inclusive" resort atmosphere. Spectators aren't just fans; many are residents staying on-site, leading to a loud, knowledgeable and electric crowd - especially during the evening sessions and the final weekend.
